Brief Description of Air Cadet CTC Summer Courses 2023

FITNESS AND SPORTS INSTRUCTOR COURSE (FSIC) - This provides cadets an opportunity to develop as a fitness and sports specialist with the skills and subject matter knowledge required to perform the role of a Fitness and Sports Instructor and a team leader for fitness and sports activities. The activities the cadets will be participating in are; personal fitness and healthy living, conducting the Cadet Fitness Assessment, and leading recreational sports. Must be medically fit, have completed Level 3 by the end of the current training year

SURVIVAL INSTRUCTOR (SIC) - This course provides cadets an opportunity to develop as a specialist with the skills and subject matter knowledge required to be an instructor and team leader for aircrew survival activities within the Air Cadet Program. They will be participating in activities like instructional technique, first aid, survival and field training, and ground navigation. These cadets will also be undergoing a solo exercise where they will apply the skills learnt to survive for a varying period in a controlled woodland environment. Must be medically and physically fit and have completed Level 3 by the end of the current training year.

AIR RIFLE MARKSMANSHIP INSTRUCTOR COURSE (ARMIC) - The aim of this course is to develop individual air rifle marksmanship and summer biathlon specialty skills while reinforcing and further developing the leadership and instructional techniques skills. Sportsmanship and discipline while safely handling rifles are important skills taught on this course. Must be medically and physically fit and have completed Level 3 by the end of the current training year.

ADVANCED AVIATION (AAC) - This three-week course enables cadets to be specialists and leaders for aviation activities within the Air Cadet Program. Cadets are introduced to more advanced principles of flight, air navigation, aero engines, meteorology, and instructional techniques. Cadets also can acquire a Restricted Operator Certificate (Aeronautical) qualifying them to operate radios on aircraft and at land-based air stations. Must be medically and physically fit, and have completed Level 3 by the end of the current training year

Cadet Administration and Supply Assistant- The aim of this two-week course is to develop a specialist with the skills and subject matter knowledge required to be an administrative and supply assistant at the Corps, during regionally directed activities, and/or as a staff cadet at a CAP/CTC. The aim of this course will be accomplished by providing dynamic and challenging training that includes opportunity for practical application. The cadets will learn the theoretical and technical skills required to assist the Corps Administration and Supply Officers.

Cadet Correspondent-This s a new Digital learning program The Cadet Correspondent course is a 5-session course where the cadets learn the basics of supporting Public Affairs. The modules include how to effectively use social media, take a great photo, and become a storyteller of the corps/squadron. The cadet will need a device to capture imagery for use during the course

Cyber-This is a new digital learning program. The Cadet Cyber Training Course will be conducted over the course of 2 weeks. Cadets will be immersed into the work of Cyber Security, learning, and securing multi-platform operating systems (Windows and Ubuntu) and interact with CAF/COATS Cyber Educators. Training provided will help cadets develop the Cyber Defence skills required to compete in an online competition with other groups from across the world at the end of the course. Successful participants will acquire the skill set to lead and support cadets in virtual and cyber activities within the CCO
